## Week 4

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Common Hyphenated Words**When do you use a hyphen with 're'?**

Use a hyphen with 're' when both of these apply:

- 're' means 'again'
- leaving the hyphen out would cause confusion with another word.

To 're-sign' means to sign something again. If you left the hyphen out, you'd cause confusion with the word 'resign' (to leave your job). Use a hyphen to avoid confusing people!

**Commonly confused 're' words**

Recover: Rest and fluids help you recover quickly.

Re-cover: I must re-cover the sofa.

Reserve: Let's reserve a table at the restaurant.

Re-serve: The tennis player will re-serve the ball.

Repress: Don't repress your emotions.

Re-press: You need to re-press that shirt. It has too many wrinkles.

Resent: I resent the way you are talking to me.

Re-sent: The email didn't arrive so it was re-sent.

Relay: I ran second in the relay race.

Re-lay: The builder will re-lay the carpet.

'non' means 'not'. When added as a prefix it will give the word the opposite meaning.

'ill' means 'bad' or 'badly'. It means the opposite of 'good' or 'done well'.

The hyphen in these 're/pre/co' prefix words can be used to separate the vowels between the prefix and the root word.

Suffixes 'cial' and 'tial'**DAY FOUR**

The 'shul' sound spelt 'cial' is commonly used after a vowel.

The 'shul' sound spelt 'tial' is commonly used after a consonant.

Be careful! There are some exceptions to the rules.

Suffix 'ant'**DAY FIVE**

vacant	compliant

If the suffix follows a hard 'c' or 'g' it is 'ant'

Words derived from verbs ending 'y' use the suffix 'ant'

If there is a related word with a long 'a' in the same place use 'ant'
