accident	employment	If the word ends with the suffix 'ment' it is always spelt 'ent'.

If the suffix follows a hard 'c' or 'g' it is 'ance'. There are not many of these words.

significance

reliance

Words derived from verbs ending in 'y' use the suffix 'ance'. (Note the 'y' changes to 'i')

arrogance

hesitance

extravagance

tolerance

If there is a related word with a 'long a' in the same place use 'ance'

If the suffix follows a hard 'c' or 'g' it is 'ence'.

Words with the syllables 'cid, fid, sid, vid' before the ending will have the suffix 'ent'.

If the word is formed from a verb ending in a stressed 'er' or 'ere' the suffix would be 'ence'.

thistle	build

The silent 't' is often in the letter string 'tle'.

The silent 'n' always follows 'm'. There are not many of these words.

The silent 'u' often follows 'g' and is always followed by a vowel.

The silent 'u' is always followed by a vowel.

The silent 'w' is often followed by 'r' and the 'r' is always followed by a vowel.

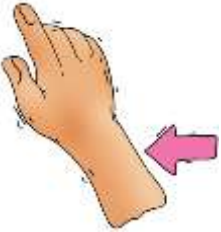

Vowels are sometimes said quickly or quietly, or the 'beat' falls elsewhere so they are not heard.

Many words with unstressed vowels contain 'en' and 'er' patterns.
