Article 28 of United Nations 'Rights of the Child' states that **all children have the right to have an education**. Unicef supports this right by fundraising, campaigning and working with governments and other organisations so that children can go to school. An education means that children can improve their chances in life, develop their talents and follow their dreams.

But what if your school did not have electricity? What if there were no books or computers? What if there were no teachers to help you learn?

Through a programme called 'Connect My School', Unicef began installing solar-powered satellite units to provide access to the Internet. They also provided child-friendly tablets filled with educational games and apps. School children can now connect with the wider world through the Internet.
