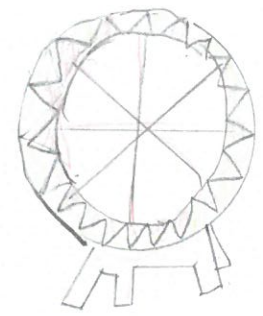
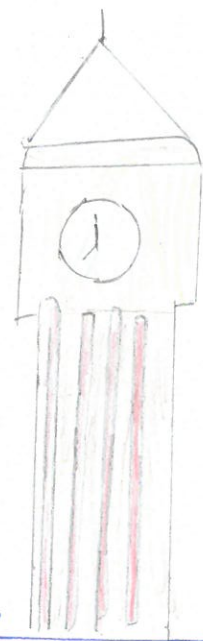

The Big Ben is Queen's tower. It has passages underground and High security.



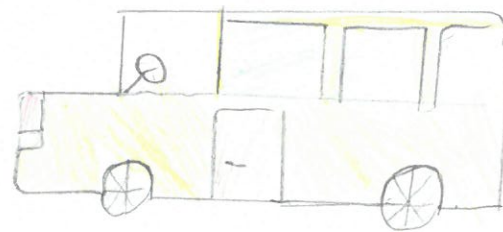
London Eye is over River Thames it was tall and pretty. I wish we could go there.

The school trip of your dreams!

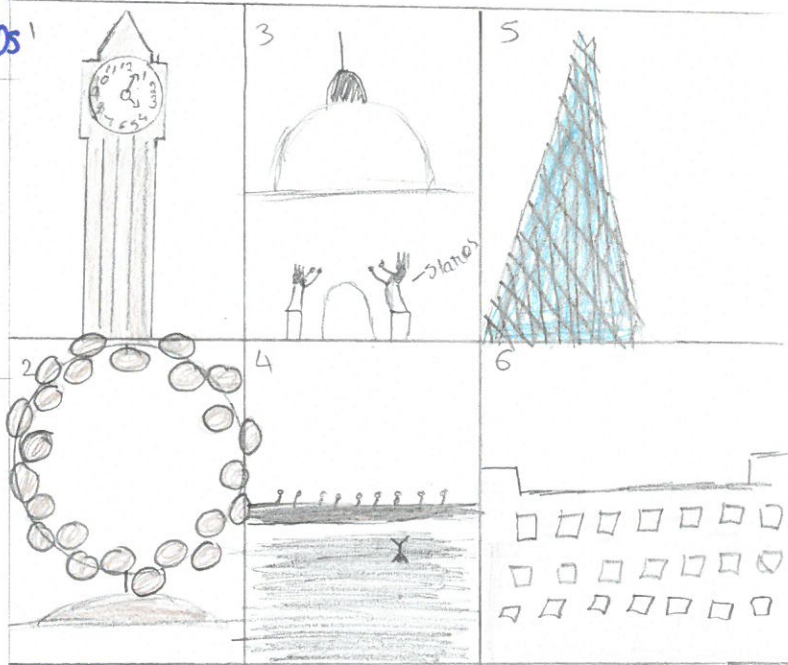

A shard of glass!

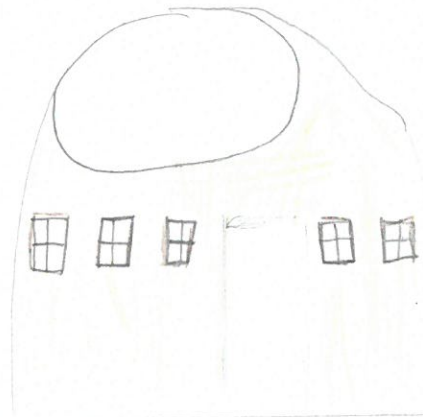
When they finally got back, after an exhausting day, beginning at half past five in the morning, no-one wanted to do anything but sleep.
